Project Overview

The South Galilee Coal Project (SGCP) is a proposed new coal mine that will be situated to the south-west of the township of Alpha. AMCI (Alpha) Pty Ltd (AMCI) and Alpha Coal Pty Ltd (Bandanna Energy) have formed a joint venture to investigate the feasibility of a new mine in this area.

AMCI and Bandanna Energy propose to establish a Technical Reference Group (TRG) to provide a formal communications process to discuss and address technical or specialist issues relating to the SGCP. The TRG will be an open and honest forum for discussing technical aspects relating to the SGCP.

TRG Objectives

The objectives of the TRG are to:

- provide factual, accurate information about the SGCP and any potential environmental, social and economic impacts;
- identify, understand and discuss issues of concern;
- discuss strategies to mitigate any potential impacts;
- demonstrate that the opinions and views of technical specialists will be considered during the planning and operation of the SGCP;
- encourage a level of confidence within local, State and Federal governments, and other identified representative groups that the mining operation will be managed in an environmentally and socially responsible manner; and,
- if the opportunity arises, liaise with TRGs from nearby projects where there is the potential for cumulative impacts and mutually beneficial sharing of information.
